

Newsletter 9th November 2021

We are in the second-half of the Autumn Term and school remains as busy as every in the run up to Christmas. Here are the diary dates and some explanation of what is to come for the rest of this term.

Covid Update

The Local Authority remains extremely concerned around the Covid-19 position in our area. In response to the rising levels of COVID infection across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, they have had their application to be designated as an Enhanced Response Area (ERA) approved. This means that schools are having to adhere to extra measures to try to limit the spread of COVID-19. The majority of these apply to secondary schools but at primary level these are:

- Reintroduction of face coverings for staff in communal spaces but not in classrooms.
- Staff socially distance from each other within school buildings including in shared spaces such as staff rooms, where possible. Teaching will continue face to face as normal.
- All visitors to schools must wear face coverings in school buildings.
- All non-essential events where parents visit schools are moved to being held virtually.
- School staff will continue their twice weekly LFD testing.

We are still managing to get away quite lightly with cases here at Offord. Please continue to be vigilant, undertake LFTs if unsure and if your child has COVID-19 symptoms do not send them to school and organise a PCR test. Please keep us informed of any illnesses and any positive results – Thank you.

School Playground – Latest

The playground was resurfaced over the half-term break and looks lovely – it is very flat and smooth now, two words that we definitely couldn't use to describe it before! It needs to 'harden' (I'm sure there's a more technical word) before we can put any playground markings on. We will work with the children to decide what we would like on the playground and these will hopefully be able to be laid in the summer.

The builders from Playscheme arrived Monday morning and have begun the installation of the new equipment. So far a digger has been removing the lumps of concrete from the old equipment and dug holes for the new posts.

Hopefully it will be finished this week, so we can start using it next week. The children are very excited and it is lovely that it is being installed while the school is open so they can watch the build progressing during the week.

I must say a massive thank you to the people that helped remove the old equipment a couple of weeks ago. The chosen weekend ended up being when there was our little Covid outbreak and lots of illness, so volunteers were rather depleted, but we did it. Thank you so much.

We are going to organise an official 'Grand Opening' of the play equipment. I have invited Jane from Love to Move to come to cut the ribbon. We can also present the cheque to them for the money raised through the marathon. We are just trying to settle on a date but will let you know once it's been organised.

Thank you again for all your fundraising efforts last year to allow this to happen.

School Dinner Ordering

School dinners need to be ordered and paid for via School Grid in advance of the day of the meal.

School meals can be ordered now up until the end of the school term.

If you have ordered a meal and your child is absent, the meal gets cancelled by the office so you will not be charged for the meal.

If you have already ordered a meal for Tuesday 14th December, please can you have another look as this has now been changed to our Christmas Dinner menu, so will need re-ordering. Thank you.

Parent Consulations

Last year we trialed School Cloud as a platform for holding Parent Consultations. Although the feedback was very positive from both parents and staff we decided to not take out a full subscription as we thought parent meetings would return to 'normal'.

Well here we are again, wanting to hold meetings but being discouraged from allowing parents into the building, therefore we have bought the package and will use School Cloud for this (and possibly future) parent meetings.

Meetings will be available at various times during the week of 15th Novemeber.

We're just organising all the appointment slots and will let you know when it goes live and send some extra information out as reminders for what you need to do.

Kingswood

Kingfishers class had an amzing week at Kingswood, Dearne Valley (near Doncaster) last week. Thankfully all the children had recovered from their pre half term illnesses and were able to attend. Unfortunately this wasn't the case for Miss Brown, who has a Covid scare at the beginning of the week.

This meant that I was quickly called to action and went on the trip. I was so pleased that I did as, I was so lovely seeing the children work together and try new things. The children really threw themselves into the activites and had a wonderful time.

Thankfully Miss Brown got the all clear and was able to get to Doncaster on the Tuesday night.

Y2 Phonics Screening Check

This is one of the statatory assessments that all schools have to complete.

Ususally phonic screening checks take place in the summer term of Y1, but as all assessments were cancelled last year, this test is taking place now for all year 2 children.

It is a reading exercise that happens 1:1 with a teacher. The children are asked to read a list of words, both real and 'nonsense' or 'alien' words. This allows their phonic understanding to be checked.

If a child means the expected level, then no further tests will be carried out. If they are not meeting the expected level, they will retake the test in the summer term. The Year 1 children will be taking this test in Summer 2022. Reading using phonics is the way we teach children in school and the process behind our Read, Write Inc books. The children are used to this type of test and should not be worried about it.

Assessments in maths, and reading will continue to happen termly for all children from Y2 to Y6. We use the results to target learning in school and to ensure the children are familiar with tests for when they need to take the statatory Standard Assessment Tests (SATs). The SATs for Y2 and Y6 will be taken next summer. We will have a meeting with parents to explain these tests in the new year. If we can't hold a meeting in person we will ensure that we still share the information with you in another format.
