#### **Covid Update**

Thank you so much for being vigilant and responding quickly to requests for testing over this last couple of weeks. It has been two weeks since the start of our outbreak and children have begun returning to school. We are still getting the odd person testing positive, but it is definitely slowing down. We have heard of children sharing the virus with their parents — we do hope all of you are not suffering too much and will be back to full health soon.

One of the main issues was that many of the children have been asymptomatic. By all carrying out a PCR and regular Lateral Flow Tests it did seem that these positive cases were quickly picked up. So thank you so much for being vigilant and sensible with testing and sending your children to school.

Last week, the teachers delivered hybrid lessons and the children attended assemblies online too. It was good to see those children that could make it. Thank you for your support with helping this to happen.

We're hoping that we are over the worst of our outbreak. Let's hope that we can all remain well for the next few weeks and everyone can have a super and much needed and deserved Christmas.

We will be attended every Thursday for 6 weeks starting on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> January (the second day back after the Christmas holidays). Hawks and Kingfishers will be travelling by coach and each class will have a half hour lesson. This will be taught by both class teachers and a swimming teacher.
