Y6 – Hinchingbrooke Transition Days

The Y6 children will spend three days at Hinchingbrooke School on Tuesday 5th, Wednesday 6th and Thursday 7th. All the information has been sent direct to parents from Hinchingbrooke. It is our understanding that the children will attend all three days at their new school, using the normal school transport to get themselves there. School Disco – Monday 18th July

Sports Morning – Tuesday 19th July

Our annual sports day is being held on the morning of Tuesday 19th July, beginning from 9am (stay after drop off).

Parents and families are invited to come to watch to encourage and support the action. Children will be in teams of either red, white, blue or green. Letters have gone home tellng you what colour team your child is in, we are asking that they wear a t-shirt of that colour.

If you were here last year, the format is going to be similar to then. There will be group activities first for the teams to earn points for their colour teams. After a short break, we will have some races on the track including obstacle races, dressing-up races and the finals of the running races.

The winning colour team will be awarded the Offord School Sports trophy.

Parents are also invited to stay and have a school dinner with their children straight after sports day. We are envisaging the sports morning to finish about mid-day and if you stay for lunch, you can leave at approximately at 1pm.
