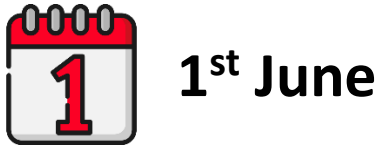




Information regarding the next Phase of opening for Offord Primary School

From 8th June for children in Years Reception, 1 and 6

What is changing?



From 1st June, the Government expects schools to re-open for children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. Schools will continue to provide childcare for key workers' children and vulnerable children. The earliest date for reopening at the Cam Academy Primary phase schools is **Monday 8th June**.

What about their brothers and sisters?



Only children in the year groups above can attend.



Children in years 2-5 need to stay at home for now.



Siblings will continue to receive home learning tasks as they do now.

Will school be safe?



If a child or a family member has any symptoms they **MUST stay at home**.



Everyone will wash their hands on entry and regularly during the day.



Surfaces and equipment will be cleaned regularly.



Toys and equipment will be restricted if they cannot be easily cleaned.



A one-way system will be in operation for drop off and collection times.



Parents, carers and household groups **MUST** still maintain 2m distance from others.



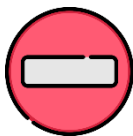
There will be less children in a room together.



There will be changes to the school day including start & finish times.



Groups will be kept apart as much as possible but **social distancing will NOT be possible** within groups.



Visitors, **including parents and carers**, will **NOT** be allowed in school without a prior appointment.

What if someone gets the virus in school?

The adult or child with symptoms must self-isolate for 7 days and arrange to be tested

The people who live with that person must also self-isolate for 14 days.



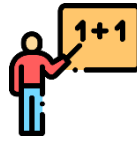

If anyone attending school tests positive, their WHOLE CLASS GROUP must self-isolate for 14 days.

What else will be different?



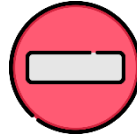
Children will be split into different groups to normal.



Children might have a different teacher or teaching assistant.



Children might be in different classrooms.



Groups will be restricted to one or two spaces in school.



Children might NOT be with or able to see their normal friends.



Social distancing between children & adults in the same group will NOT be possible.



All children will need to bring a water bottle. No food will be provided at school.



Break times will be at separate times for each group.



There will be changes to the school day including start & finish times.



Normal attendance rules do NOT apply and NO FINES will be issued for non-attendance.



Children with additional needs, including those with an EHCP, may NOT have access to their normal levels of support e.g. additional adults, resources or intervention groups such as Sensory Circuits.



Children will NOT have their normal lessons and will follow the similar tasks and activities being sent to those still at home.
