RECEPTION BASELINE ASSESSMENT

This is a statutory assessment that all children must complete within the first 6 weeks of starting school. This year the assessment has changed and is mostly completed on an ipad, with additional teacher questions and questions that encourage children to use concrete resources. A booklet detailing the assessment will be sent to families on Parenthub.

We aim to make these assessments as relaxed as possible so that the children feel like they are just playing games!

The assessment results are revisited at the end of year 6 to track children's progress across their time in primary School.



ATTENDANCE MATTERS

- Punctual start- learning begins with an early morning task at 8.40am as soon as the doors open. Children often find it embarrassing to arrive late to school.
- Government legislation has a focus on improving attendance for all. If you're unsure if your child is well enough to attend school, please send them in and we will assess them.

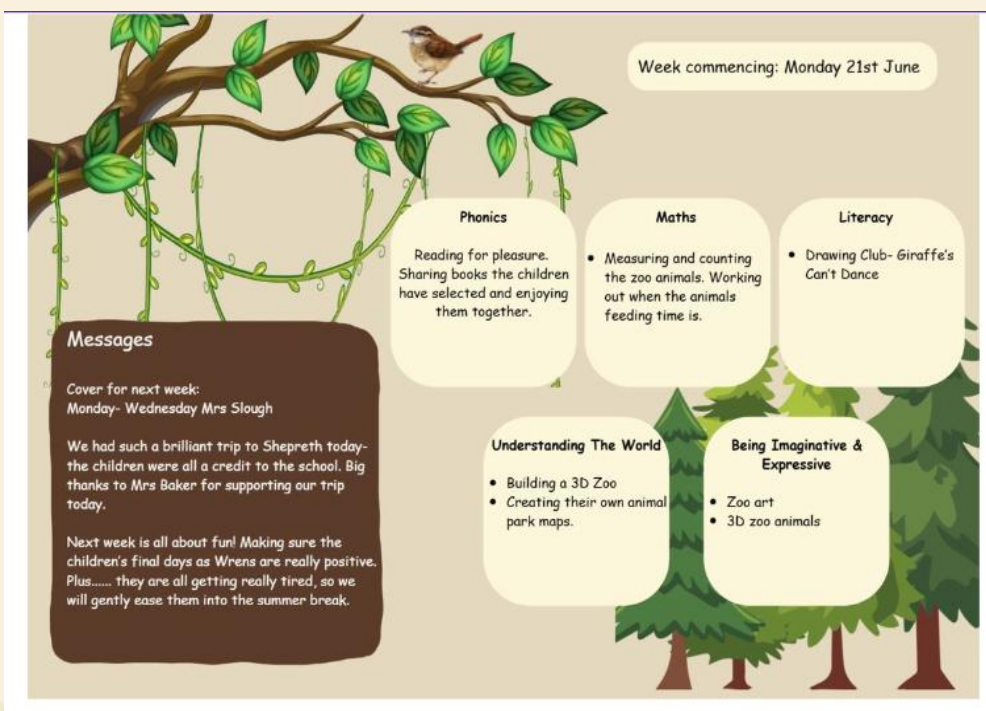
Supporting behaviour

- Cambridgeshire Therapeutic Thinking underpins our behaviour policy and all that we do in school. Please read the policy on our website for a deeper understanding.
- Our approach is based on intrinsic motivation for children to show valued behaviours.
- Rewards- these are logical and related to what the children do. This is predominantly through praise and celebration assemblies.
- Consequences- all behaviour has a consequence which can be positive and negative. If a child is displaying detrimental behaviour, there will of course be logical consequences in place to keep everyone safe and to teach valued behaviours.
- High expectations- we expect all children to own their behaviour and be their best self.
- We are an inclusive school, and will work hard with parents and children who demonstrate the most challenging behaviour. This can look different for individual children (equality verses equity).



SEESAW

Seesaw is the platform teachers use to communicate with families. Families will be given a Seesaw login when their children first start school. Parents are encouraged to post photographs, videos and comments about what their children are doing at home. We will share these in school with the rest of the class. All important communication from the office & first aid incidents will be sent through ParentHub.



Weekly updates will be sent every Friday at 3.30pm.

BREAK TIMES

- *At break and lunch time children will play in zoned areas that offer opportunities for different types of play. Children will have the opportunity to try skipping, tyre fun, hoops, wheelie boards, giant connect four, and a range of sports including, climbing wall, scooting, cycling and cricket.*
- *Children should bring appropriate clothing for all weathers as we understand the importance of outdoor play in all seasons.*
- *Snacks- FS will be provided with a fruit snack to have in class. Children are entitled to free milk until they turn 5 after which milk can be ordered and paid for.*
- *School meals- Please ensure you make your child's menu choice via Parentpay in advance.*



P.E

Children will have PE indoors on a Monday afternoon. On a Friday afternoon they will have gross motor activities outside. They will only need their PE kit on a Monday.



Physical Education

We will have PE in all weathers, so please make sure children have rain coats for poor weather.

FOREST

This will be every Wednesday afternoon with Mrs Day.

Forest School is a child centred inspirational learning process, that offers opportunities for holistic growth through regular sessions. It is a long-term program that supports play, exploration and supported risk taking. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands-on experiences in a natural setting.

Forest school will run in most weathers (with the exception of high winds and storms) to ensure children have regular exposure. Please ensure your children come with appropriate clothing for the session.

Parent workshops

EEF research suggests that where parents are involved in their children's learning, children make on average, an extra four months progress.

Reading workshop- 7th October 2025 2.30-3pm

Writing workshop- 21st October 2025 9-10am

Maths workshop- 4th November 2025 9-10am

Some of these workshops will involve seeing the children in class.

This will be dependent on how well the children settle into school.





ASSESSMENTS



At the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage (June 2025) children will be assessed against the Early Learning Goals. There are 17 Early Learning Goals and teachers will make judgements as to whether your child is emerging or expected for each learning goal. Pupils who secure expected in the five prime areas (Reading, Writing, C&L, PSED and Physical Development) reach a Good Level of Development (GLD).

In the Spring term there will be a parent evening to go over all of the goals.
